Pamela B. Teaster is the Director of the Center for Gerontology and a Professor in the Department of Human Development and Family Science at Virginia Tech. She is the Secretary General of the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse and is on the Board of Trustees of the Center for Guardianship Certification. She serves on the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Elder Abuse and Neglect*.

Dr. Teaster is a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America and the Association for Gerontology in Higher Education, and a recipient of the Isabella Horton Grant Award for Guardianship, the Rosalie Wolf Award for Research on Elder Abuse, the Outstanding Affiliate Member Award (Kentucky Guardianship Association), and the Distinguished Educator Award (Kentucky Association for Gerontology). She serves on the board of the National Committee for the Prevention of Elder Abuse and is a former president.

Her areas of scholarship include the abuse of elders and vulnerable adults, public and private guardianship, end-of-life issues, ethical treatment of older adults, public policy and public affairs, and quality of life. She has published over 100 scholarly articles, reports, and book chapters and is editor/author of five books.

Before joining Virginia Tech, Dr. Teaster spent 12 years at the University of Kentucky as professor, associate dean for research, and director of doctoral studies in the College of Public Health.

She received her Ph.D. and a certificate in gerontology from Virginia Tech, and a master's degree and a bachelor's degree from the University of Tennessee at Knoxville.
