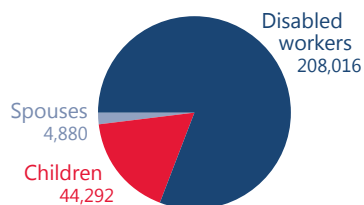
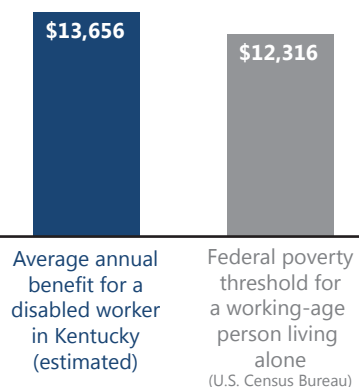




## Most DI beneficiaries in Kentucky are disabled workers
